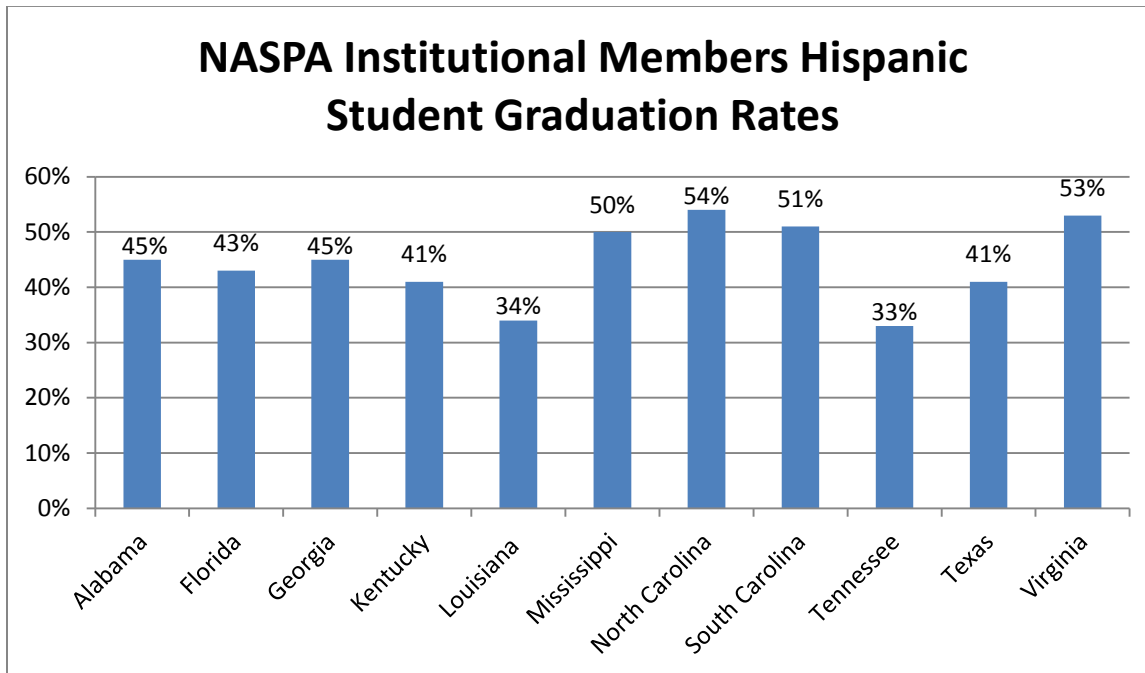


Region III: Hispanic Graduation Rates and Resource Centers

The purpose of this Quarter III Snapshot is to provide an overview of the Hispanic/Latino college student graduation rates among NASPA Institutional Members in Region III. In addition, information regarding on campus resource centers for Hispanic students is included. This is the third in a series of quarterly snapshots about the Hispanic population in the states of NASPA Region III. Region III consists of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia.

The purpose for the series of quarterly snapshots is to provide insight to those seeking to learn more information about the Hispanic community in higher education and could be used as a reference for those conducting research. The idea for the series arose from a NASPA LKC Region III roundtable at the 2013 National Conference that discussed the misconceptions about Latinos in higher education and ways that the LKC can better inform administrators in higher education about the Latino community.

The chart below provides the average Hispanic student graduation rates of Institutional Members for each state in Region III. The average was calculated by adding up the NASPA Institutional Members Hispanic graduation percentage and dividing by the number of institutions.

As noted in the Quarter I Snapshotⁱ, the Hispanic population in the United States is growing rapidly in Region III. Alabama, Kentucky, South Carolina and Tennessee experienced above 100% Hispanic population growth from 2000 to 2010. Along with this surge in Hispanic population, there has also been a surge in Hispanic college enrollment. The top three states in Region III with increases in Hispanic college enrollment are North Carolina (104%), Mississippi (99%) and Georgia (96%). However, the NASPA Institutional Members in these states still all have under 15% Hispanic student enrollment. Nationally, this year marked the third year of increases in Hispanic college student enrollment. In addition, for the first time, there is a greater share of Hispanic recent high school graduates enrolled in college than white recent high school graduatesⁱⁱ.

Observations:

Larger Alabama public schools, Auburn University, University of Alabama at Birmingham and the University of Alabama all have Hispanic graduation rates greater than 50%. Small private schools such as Samford University and Spring Hill College both have Hispanic graduation rates greater than 60%. Smaller public schools and community colleges have graduations rates of less than 50%. Most schools in the state have both Institutional Resource Centers and Hispanic Student Associations.

All Institutional Members except for Beacon College, Eckerd College, Eastern Florida State College, Edward Waters College, Florida National University and Saint Thomas University have either a Institutional Resource Center or a Hispanic Student Association in the state of Florida. The University of Florida has the highest Hispanic graduation rate in the state. The University of Miami has the highest graduation rate of the Hispanic Serving Institutions in Region III. Florida State University has the highest number of Hispanic Student Associations in Region III.

Every NASPA Institutional Member except for Atlanta Technical College, the College of Coastal Georgia, Columbus State University and Morehouse College in the state of Georgia has either a Institutional Resource Center or Student Association for Hispanic students. The College of Coastal Georgia, has a 0% Hispanic graduation rate, but this may be due to a low Hispanic enrollment of 5%. Another NASPA Institutional Member without an Institutional Resource Center or a Hispanic Student Association is Columbus State University; however, it does have a Hispanic graduation rate of 64%.

All Institutional Members in Kentucky have either an Institutional Resource Center or a Hispanic Student Association, and most have both. The exception is Kentucky Community and Technical College System, which has a Hispanic graduation rate of 19%. Morehead State University has the highest Hispanic graduation rate in the state, with 70%.

Loyola University in the state of Louisiana has an Institutional Resource Center as well as a Student Association for Hispanic students and a 75% Hispanic graduation rate. Louisiana Delta Community College has neither, but still has a 50% Hispanic graduation rate. Louisiana State University and A&M is the largest Institution in Louisiana, has both an Institutional Resource Center and a Hispanic Student Association, with a Hispanic graduation rate of 59%.

Mississippi Community Colleges have Hispanic graduation rates of less than 10%. One of the community colleges, Copiah-Lincoln Natchez Campus, has both an Institutional Resource Center and Hispanic Student Associations. Hinds Community College has neither. Jackson State University and the University of Mississippi have Hispanic graduation rates greater than 60%. Other public schools, such as University of Southern Mississippi, which has neither an Institutional Resource Center nor Student Association, and Mississippi State University, which has both, have below 50% Hispanic graduation rates.

The University of North Carolina Chapel Hill has the highest Hispanic graduation rate out of the University of North Carolina system (86%), the rest of the system has less than 60% Hispanic graduation rates. Fifteen schools have Hispanic graduation rates higher than 50%. The distribution is fairly even between public and private schools. Most schools have both Institutional Resource Centers and Hispanic Student Associations, although twelve schools have neither.

Wofford College and Furman University in South Carolina have both an Institutional Resource Center and Student Association for Hispanic students and have Hispanic graduation rates of 86%. Furman University, Presbyterian College, and the University of South Carolina have Hispanic graduation rates of 75% or higher. Midlands Technical College has neither an Institutional Resource Center nor Hispanic Student Association, and a Hispanic graduation rate of 11%.

The University of Tennessee has the most Institutional Resource Centers in the state of Tennessee, along with a 51% Hispanic graduation rate. Vanderbilt University has the highest Hispanic graduation rate in the state with 86%, followed by Belmont University with an 82% Hispanic graduation rate. Austin Peay State University has neither an Institutional Resource Center nor a Hispanic Student Association, and has a Hispanic graduation rate of 11%.

Texas has 34 institutions with less than 50% Hispanic graduation rates and 14 with higher than 50% graduation rates. Community Colleges in Texas have less than 15% Hispanic graduation rates. Most schools in the state have either an Institutional Resource Center or Hispanic Student Association. Southwestern University has the highest Hispanic graduation rate in the state at 77%.

Virginia has 7 Institutional Member with Hispanic graduation rates higher than 80%. Every Institutional Member in the state of Virginia except for Christendom College has either an Institutional Resource Center or a Student Association.

The following pages provide detailed snapshots of each state. These snapshots list the NASPA Institutional Members and their respective Hispanic graduation rates.
