

Region I: Hispanic Graduation Rates and Resource Centers

The purpose of the Region I Snapshots is to provide insight about the Hispanic* community in higher education. We aim to provide this resource for students, professionals, and researchers interested in Latino/a's in higher education and hope that these Snapshot reports will be used as a resource regarding the changing landscape in higher education as it pertains to Hispanics.

The purpose of Snapshot III is to provide an overview of the Hispanic/Latino college student graduation rates in Region I which includes the states of Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont (we have not included international entities in the Snapshots).

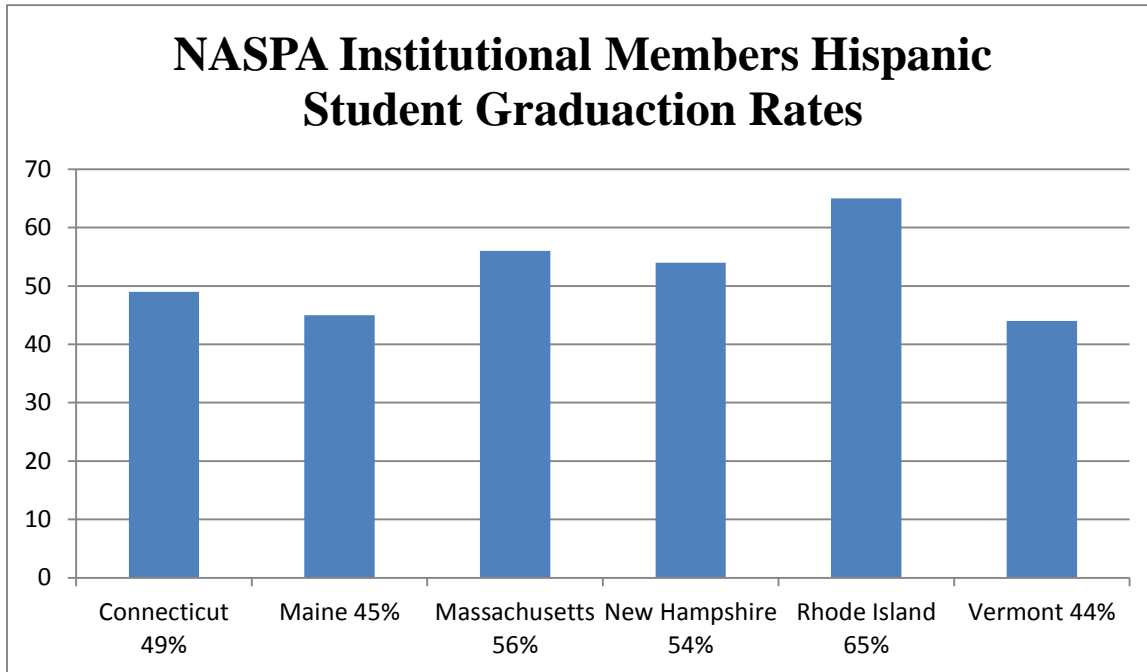

This is the third of a series of snapshots. Snapshot I provided statistics on the Hispanic population in Region I. Snapshot II provided an overview of Hispanic/ Latino college enrollment in Region I. The upcoming snapshot (IV) will summarize the previous three Snapshots, which include information about Hispanic population growth, Hispanic student enrollment in higher education as well as Hispanic student graduation rates and Institutional Resource Centers.

*Please note for the purpose of the Snapshots, Hispanic and Latino will be used interchangeably.

The chart below provides the average Hispanic student graduation rates of Institutional Members for each state in Region I. The average was calculated by adding up the NASPA Institutional Members Hispanic graduation percentage and dividing by the number of institutions.

Observations:

- The overall Hispanic graduation rate for NASPA Region I is 52%
- Most institutional resource centers for Hispanic/Latino students can be found in the Multicultural/Intercultural Centers.
- 60% or 12 out of /20 of reported schools in Connecticut offer resource centers for Hispanic students.
- 90% or 18 out of /20 of reported schools in Connecticut offer Student Associations for Hispanic students.
- 100% or 4 out 4 of reported schools in Maine offer resource centers for Hispanic students.
- 75% or 3 out of 4 of reported schools in Maine offer Student Associations for Hispanic students.
- 78% or 42 out of 54 of reported schools in Massachusetts offer resource centers for Hispanic students.
- 91% or 49 out of 54 of reported schools in Massachusetts offer Student Associations for Hispanic students.
- 89% or 8 out of /9 of reported schools in New Hampshire offer resource centers for Hispanic students.
- 44% or 4 out of 9 of reported schools in New Hampshire offer Student Associations for Hispanic students.
- 100% or 9 out of 9 of reported schools in Rhode Island offer resource centers for Hispanic students.
- 78% or 7 out of 9 of reported schools in Rhode Island offer Student Associations for Hispanic students.
- 71% or 5 out of 7 of reported schools in Vermont offer resource centers for Hispanic students.
- 71% or 5 out of 7 of reported schools in Vermont offer Student Associations for Hispanic students.
- Rhode Island has the highest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate with 65%.
- Vermont has the lowest graduation rate with 44%.
- Yale University has the highest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Connecticut with 97%.
- Capital Community College has the lowest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Connecticut with 7%.
- Colby College has the highest Hispani/Latinoc graduation rate in the state of Maine with 86%.
- Thomas College has the lowest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Maine with 0%.
- Franklin W. Olin College of Engineering has the highest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Massachusetts with 100%

- Bay State College and Mount Wachusett Community College have the lowest Hispanic graduation rate in the state of Massachusetts with 6%.
- Daniel Webster College has the highest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of New Hampshire with 100%.
- Colby Sawyer College has the lowest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of New Hampshire with 22%.
- Brown University has the highest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Rhode Island with 90%.
- Rhode Island College has the lowest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Rhode Island with 41%.
- University of Vermont has the highest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Vermont with 97%.
- Landamrk College has the lowest Hispanic/Latino graduation rate in the state of Vermont with 20%.
- All Ivy League schools in Region I (Yale, Harvard, and Brown) have Hispanic graduation rates of 90% or above.
