NASPA launches fourth year of the Lead Initiative

74 colleges and universities are committed to advancing best practices of civic learning and democratic engagement as part of every student's college education

WASHINGTON, D.C. —NASPA-Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education announces the members of the National Initiative on Civic Learning and Democratic Engagement (Lead Initiative), which recognizes and supports a network of 74 colleges and universities with strong commitments to civic learning and democratic engagement.

“The NASPA Lead Initiative highlights institutions that embed leadership and democratic engagement within the civic mission of higher education,” says NASPA President Kevin Kruger. “These 74 institutions provide opportunities to their students during which they develop commitment to becoming active and engaged citizens in their community and beyond. We are pleased to announce the 2015 cohort of Lead Initiative Institutions.”

Selected institutions, representing public and private four-year and two-year colleges and universities, have committed to a set of strategies to work in partnership with on- and off-campus constituents to influence students' ongoing commitment to civic learning and democratic engagement, including:

- building clear and tangible civic learning and democratic engagement activities into student affairs division strategic goals and learning outcomes;
- collecting and reporting data on the efficacy of campus efforts using tools that measure gains in civic learning and democratic engagement; and
- creating strategies in collaboration with students that increase civic learning and help solve community problems through collective action.
