



APPLICATION AT FLORIDA STATE

Interactional Programming Model (IPM) proposal approved July 2013 to pilot for 2013-2014 academic year.

Two community style residence halls built in the early 1960s

Single gender floors in co-ed buildings

Average RA to resident ratio 1:30

31 out of 160 RAs utilized model

ATAGLANCE

Intentional Interactions focusing on five tenets

Two floor activities during the month, may or may not be based upon tenets

One tenet based All-Hall Program every month

Tenet based bulletin boards monthly

ASSESSMENT METHODS

Compare EBI results from 2012-2013 academic year to this year's results.

Individual satisfaction surveys sent out to residents
