Position Description:

The BACCHUS State Coordinator is responsible for:

- Communication with institutions of higher education within their state about programs, services, and professional development opportunities available to them through the BACCUS Initiatives of NASPA.
- Maintaining connection and updating contact lists with peer education groups/ advisors within their state and region.
- Offering support to campus members who are struggling or just getting started.
- Working with the regional team (BACCHUS Regional Consultant, BACCHUS State Coordinators, and Student Advisory Committee) to set goals for the region.
- Assist in the coordination and implementation of a Regional Spring Conference, including program and award selection, keynote speaker coordination and on site logistics (when possible).

Qualifications:

- State Coordinators must be a NASPA Professional Affiliate working at a NASPA Institutional Member Campus.
- State Coordinators must be professionals working in some capacity of student affairs, wellness, or health promotion.
- State Coordinators should be on a campus that has an active BACCHUS
 Initiatives of NASPA peer education group, or a working knowledge of peer education efforts
