Leadership & Member Engagement

Director's Report -- Tracy Poon Tambascia

The Faculty Council has been working on two significant issues this fall, and both are forward-looking: NASPA Strategic Planning, including a focus on scholarship and the work of faculty in the association; and the role of graduate preparation programs in preparing new professionals and leaders in the field.

The emerging Strategic Plan objectives will include scholarship, research, and practice, and ways in which faculty both engage in and lead that work. Faculty have the opportunity to add their perspectives and voices about their professional needs and contributions in the Strategic Plan, through online surveys, regional conferences and online discussions.

NASPA is also bringing together faculty and senior student affairs officers (SSAO's) to discuss graduate programs, and how faculty and practitioners can work together to ensure that new professionals are prepared to work in dynamic and challenging campus environments, and to increase professional commitment to the field. This conversation is on-going, with more dialogue to come in the next several months.

Our challenge is to be forward-looking, while also managing the daily and weekly commitments we hold to our campuses and to our Faculty Council programs. Our Council members are supporting a wide range of programs every month, from emerging leadership to skills development and community building. I hope you choose to participate in some of our programs - online, in person, or at an event at the annual conference in Los Angeles.

Susan Longerbeam - Conference Leadership Committee

Scholarly Papers: The Scholarly Papers Committee was active in recruiting programs by developing video and sharing the call for programs on social media and national listservs.

The Scholarly Papers Committee reviewed and discussed 85 proposals. Subsequently, the Conference Leadership Committee finalized those reviews and chose 38 scholarly paper proposals for presentation at annual conference. Each proposal was reviewed 3-6 times by a community of scholar reviewers, and all received reviewer comments supporting paper development—for both those accepted and those rejected. The Committee is currently recruiting discussants.

Faculty Liaison to Annual Conference: A blog posted to the conference site details the development of faculty programs for NASPA Los Angeles. The Faculty Council has developed means to increase communication to the Faculty Assembly about all conference programs for faculty leading up to the conference, including blogs, videos, and interactive online sessions.
