Leadership & Member Engagement

Faculty Council Policies and Procedures

- Rozana Carducci, Member-at-Large, and Anna Ortiz, Past Faculty Division Director, revised and edited the NASPA Assembly/Faculty Council Policies and Procedures. The Policies and Procedures were accepted and adopted on November 11, 2015.

Faculty Mentor/Mentee Program

- Brian McCoy and Jody Donovan coordinate; have 14 Mentees and 13 Mentors participating (one mentor has two mentees); Faculty mentors and mentees received pairings via email in September; Follow-up "status-check" email sent in late October

Online Faculty Forum – On Demand Professional Development

- Developed and coordinated by Bill Arnold and Matt Varga to provide an informal forum for topical discussion using a web conference platform. The moderated the first forum on October 28th and are seeking other faculty to moderate in the future.

Faculty Blogs

- Shannon Dean is coordinating the blog site for NASPA faculty website - a number faculty have contributed or are scheduled to contribute

Scholarly Papers and Concurrent Sessions at Annual Conference

- Sam Museus and Erica Yamamura with the help of Jörg Vianden and other Faculty Assembly members have recruited, approved and slated scholarly papers and faculty oriented presentations for the national conference.
- 154 submitted programs tagged for Faculty; 71 accepted
- 66 submitted scholarly papers; 33 selected

NASPA Foundation Large Grant Selection

- Jörg Vianden is providing Faculty Council representation on the NASPA Foundation Large Grant Call for Proposals. He will be involved with the submission and selection process.

NASPA Emerging Faculty Leader Academy

- Pam Havice developed and will be launching and coordinating the NASPA Emerging Faculty Leader Academy; selected Phyllis McCluskey-Titus from Faculty Assembly as co-coordinator; Academy is a selective professional development opportunity geared towards the early career faculty as requested from the Faculty Assembly; applications are due December 1, 2015 with the first class being selected and introduced at the 2016 NASPA conference.

Liaisons to Other NASPA Entities

- FC working to develop a procedure by which the Faculty Assembly/Council could serve in liaison positions with other NASPA entities. For example, the FC is working with the NASPA Case Studies chair, Sarah Marshall, and with Director of Research & Policy Institute, Amelia Parnell to provide consultation.

- REGION I - Brian McCoy has coordinated a Faculty Luncheon/Faculty Summit for November 16-18, 2015; Summit topic: Using Mobile Devices to Engage Students - Jennifer Fleury, Assistant Professor at Nichols College in Dudley, MA
- REGION II – Pietro Sasso is coordinating the Region II conference in June 2016 with PCPA (PA) and CSPA (NY) faculty representatives; assisting with coordinating case study competition; promoting the Emerging Leader Faculty Academy within the region
