Leadership & Member Engagement

Leadership/Volunteer Management

- Faculty Council (FC) member/Director, Pam Havice, served on the ACPA/NASPA Task Force on Professional Competencies. Task Force completed its charge with submission of a report and draft of the document to both boards at the July 2015 meetings.
- 2nd year of Faculty Mentoring program. Jody Donovan and Brian McCoy led the effort and established mentor/mentee teams that began in August 2015.

Faculty Council Policies and Procedures

- Rozana Carducci, Member-at-Large, and Anna Ortiz, Past Faculty Division Director, revised and edited the NASPA Assembly/Faculty Council Policies and Procedures. The Policies and Procedures (P/P) were accepted and adopted on November 11, 2015.
- Posted approved P/P on Faculty Council webpage, November 2015.
- Sent out the P/P to the NASPA Faculty Assembly in the February 2016 Faculty Assembly newsletter.

Faculty Mentor/Mentee Program

- Brian McCoy and Jody Donovan coordinate; had 14 Mentees and 13 Mentors participating (one mentor has two mentees); Faculty mentors and mentees have been in communication. Follow-up “status-check” email sent in late October. Encouraged to meet at the annual conference.

Online Faculty Forum – On Demand Professional Development

- Developed and coordinated by Bill Arnold and Matt Varga to provide an informal forum for monthly topical discussions using a web conference platform. They moderated the first faculty forum on October 28th.
- These monthly web conferences are meant to be forums, exchanges of ideas, not webinars. The intent is to support collaboration, knowledge sharing, and problem solving. In addition, we anticipate these sessions will influence the Faculty Council agenda and support conference program development addressing needs and interests of program faculty. Scholarly Papers and Concurrent Sessions at Annual Conference

- Sam Museus and Erica Yamamura with the help of Jörg Vianden and other Faculty Assembly members recruited, approved and slated scholarly papers, discussants, and faculty oriented presentations for the national conference.
- 154 submitted programs tagged for Faculty; 71 accepted
- 66 submitted scholarly papers; 33 selected

NASPA Annual Conference

- Casandra Harper developed a “Conference-at-a-Glance” sheet with faculty-focused events to share with all faculty that was distributed before the conference.
- Rozanna Carducci coordinated events for the Faculty Lounge, including coffee breaks, teaching roundtables and faculty dialogue groups.
- Susan Longerbeam organized appropriate publishers to be present in the Faculty Lounge to discuss writing projects with faculty.

Doctoral Seminar

- Susana Muñoz & Demetri Morgan, co-chairs, have planned the seminar for Sunday, March 13th from 9:00 am – 3:00 pm. The agenda includes numerous faculty from around the country as speakers as well as roundtable discussions. They are expecting the seminar to fill.

NASPA Foundation Large Grant Selection

- Jörg Vianden has provided Faculty Council representation on the NASPA Foundation Large Grant Call for Proposals. He was involved with the submission and selection process.

NASPA Emerging Faculty Leader Academy

- Pam Havice developed and has launched the NASPA Emerging Faculty Leader Academy. Phyllis McCluskey-Titus from Faculty Assembly will be a co-coordinator with Pam.
- EFLA is a selective professional development opportunity geared towards early career faculty as requested from the Faculty Assembly.
- Seven participants, one from each region, were selected by a review committee in their respective region. The inaugural cohort will be introduced at the 2016 NASPA conference.
