How the NASPA Board Can Support the NASPA Foundation: Following the uncertainties of the Consolidation process and under the leadership of Barb Snyder, the NASPA Foundation has been strengthened and energized. While Barb will provide the full report for the Foundation, mention should be made here of the new Strategic Planning process that will parallel the NASPA Board's strategic planning process. A strategic planning meeting for the Foundation Board has been set for January 29-30, 2012, in Dallas, and will also be facilitated by Richard Keeling. Other developments include the vote to change Foundation Board officer titles to align with those of NASPA's by-law changes -- to assume the title of Director, rather than President-- and the very exciting initiative for the Research and Policy Institute to promote research on issues that most closely impact the practice of our profession that will help NASPA to strengthen its voice and leadership in higher education circles through becoming even more evidence-based.
